Governor Ricketts ends state of emergency. What does that mean for licensees?

Governor Pete Ricketts announced the end of Nebraska's coronavirus state of emergency. The Governor issued the state of emergency declaration on March 13, 2020. It officially ended at 11:59 PM on Wednesday, June 30, 2021. The Governor issued Executive Order (EO) 21-09 to rescind pandemic-related executive orders. With a few exceptions, the coronavirus executive orders will expire on July 30, 2021, which is thirty days after the state of emergency ends. Full text of EO 21-09 is available by clicking here.

What are the requirements for continuing education? How do I apply for a waiver?

On or before November 1 of each odd-numbered year, individuals holding an active license in the State of Nebraska must complete at least 20 hours of acceptable continuing education for a physical therapist and 10 hours of acceptable continuing education for a physical therapist assistant during the preceding 24-month period.

The Department will be as flexible as possible with licensees' continuing education activities (e.g. extending the number of hours allowed for home study) due to the pandemic. The following frequency asked questions are answered here (see Continuing Competency Waiver Information): https://dhhs.ne.gov/licensure/Pages/Physical-Therapy.aspx

- Q: How do I apply for a waiver of continuing competency requirements due to circumstances beyond my control?
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- Q: My credential expires after the declared emergency has been lifted. I was not able to complete the continuing competency requirements due
- Q: My profession limits the number of hours of online/home study continuing education, but in-person continuing education is not available at this time. My profession is not listed in Executive Order No. 20-10. Can I obtain all of my continuing education hours for renewal or reinstatement online or by home study?

What are acceptable and non-acceptable continuing education?

The Board does not approve continuing education programs or activities. In order for a continuing education activity or program to be accepted for renewal or reinstatement of a license, the activity or program must relate to physical therapy and may focus on research, treatment, documentation, management, or education.
